As you know, the Day School was closed on March 16, 2020 due to the Coronavirus pandemic. The staff and students have continued to keep in touch with each other over the months through online meetings. They are anxious to get back to our Day School but we have had to wait for Governor Abbott to re-open day cares. That finally happened on May 18, 2020, so our Director, Kami Connell, and her Assistant, Devon Hosey, and staff have been very busy training to learn all of the newest policies for the day school to keep our staff and students safe as they return. They assembled a policies packet and a parent letter that has been sent to the parents so they will be able to return to Grace Christian Day School on Monday, June 1, 2020. This has been approved by the Grace Session as of May 24, 2020.

There have been some major changes to how the school will be handled since the issues of COVID-19 have come about. Our main goal is to keep our students and staff safe. The most important change is that only students and staff will be allowed in the CE building. Parents will be dropping their children off at the west entrance to the school. The students and staff will have their temperatures taken at the door before coming into the building. If no fever, then they will wash their hands and proceed to their class. The school and all of our families are relying on each other to keep everyone safe. If you have a code to the CE building, please do not use it to come into the building until further notice.

Due to the ongoing changes with COVID-19, Grace Christian Day School will continue to follow the CDC and Public Health Department recommendations and guidelines as they become available. Pentecost Offering, May 31

A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. 40% of the Pentecost offering is retained by Grace to make an impact in the lives of young people within our own community. Our retained portion of the offering will be going to Blake's House. Blake's House is a mentoring home in Plano for girls, age 18-25 that have aged out of foster care or that have become homeless for other reasons. The remaining 60% is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Latest PNC Update

May Update: The PNC has completed first and second interviews and is in the process of determining the final candidate. This candidate will be submitted to Presbytery and interviewed by the COM. Once that is complete the PNC can contact the candidate and offer the the call.

We are closer to our goal and we thank all of the Grace family for their prayers and support throughout this process.
