Grace Family,

As we continue in Luke's gospel, we find Jesus in Luke 15 being criticized by the Pharisees for the company he keeps. People like prostitutes and tax collectors, people we would call "lost," are listening to Jesus. "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them," they charge.

It is in response that Jesus tells three parables. They are about a lost sheep, a lost coin, and a lost son. Wait. I have that wrong. In the parables, the main character is always God, so these are really stories about a searching shepherd, a diligent woman, and a generous father, longing for reunion, never giving up, even leaving the 99 to go after just one. Why such a diligent search? Is it really worth all the time and energy to go after just one? It is if the sheep, the coin, and the son are valuable and precious to the searcher. These parables confirm the title of this sermon series: **Every Single Person matters to Jesus**.

But Jesus is not telling this parable to the "lost" prostitutes and tax collectors. Jesus is telling this parable to the "found" Pharisees. "Suppose you had a hundred sheep and lost one," he queries them. "What would you do?" What is Jesus calling the "found" to do? What are they missing about who God is and for whom God longs? Are we sure we know who is lost and who is found?

Waves of Grace Youth Retreat - Nov. 8-9


